Requirements for the **Switch-It® Vigo Drive** software that enables the personalization of the driving experience and **Switch-It® Vigo Mouse** software that allows customization of the mousing experience:

- Either a Mac computer with Catalina operating system or later
- Or a personal computer with a Windows 10 operating system or later

# STATEMENT OF THE INTENDED PURPOSE AND USERS

The device is intended to be used as a specialty controller input device attached to power wheelchair controller systems. Users of the device are power wheelchair users who have difficulty using standard wheelchair input devices.

This device may be useful to people with the following disabilities or conditions:

- Spinal cord injuries
  - Cervical injuries
  - Herniated cervical disc
  - Central cord syndrome
- Cerebral Palsy
- Multiple sclerosis
- Muscular Dystrophy
- Tetraplegia
- Dysmelia
- Traumatic brain injuries
  - Intracranial bleeding
  - Cerebral contusions
  - Concussion
  - Intracranial haemorrhage
  - Subdural haematoma
  - Epidural haematoma

- Stroke
  - MCA and ASA infarctions
  - Lacunar infarction
- Brain tumours
- Brachial Plexus injury
- Peripheral Nerve injuries
- Acquired and congenital Myopathies
- Amyotrophic Lateral sclerosis
- Spinal muscular Atrophy

The controls for power wheelchairs are exclusively for a user who is unable to walk or has limited mobility, for their own personal use indoors and outdoors, and thus requires a power wheelchair.

Driving a powered wheelchair requires cognitive, physical, and visual skills. The user must be able to estimate and correct the results of actions when operating the wheelchair.

The user must be informed of the contents of this user manual before driving the wheelchair. In addition, the user of the wheelchair must be given thorough instruction by a qualified specialist before he or she participates in traffic. The first sessions in the wheelchair should be practised under the supervision of a trainer/adviser.

# CONTRAINDICATIONS

- Individuals with severe neck or head injuries should avoid using the device, as it may exacerbate their condition and cause further harm.
- Those with limited neck stability or control might find it challenging to maintain consistent and safe head movements, potentially leading to unintended wheelchair maneuvres.
- Individuals with certain medical conditions, such as severe vertigo or motion sickness, might experience discomfort or dizziness when using the device.
- Individuals with cognitive impairments or conditions that affect their ability to understand and respond to the device's controls might not be suitable candidates for this method of wheelchair control.

Before implementing this technology, it is essential for healthcare professionals and users to carefully assess each individual's specific needs and capabilities to ensure the safe and appropriate use of the device.

# Safety and Handling Instructions

The Switch-It® Vigo Head Drive Kit components may only be installed by a dealer authorised and trained by NowTechnologies Ltd. / Sunrise Medical. The dealer carries out the assembly according to the instructions given on the installation training. Incorrect installation might have an adverse effect on performance and will invalidate warranty.

### BATTERIES

Do not attempt to replace any of the Switch-It® Vigo System's batteries yourself – you may damage the battery, which could cause overheating, fire, and injury. The lithium-polymer battery in your Vigo headset should be serviced or recycled by NowTechnologies Ltd. or an authorised service provider and must be recycled or disposed of separately from household waste. Dispose of the batteries according to your local environmental laws and guidelines.

# THE Switch-It $\ensuremath{\mathbb{R}}$ VIGO HEADSET USES A LITHIUM-POLYMER BATTERY

Keep it away from anything that can catch fire and make sure it cannot get hit by sharp objects.

For charging, only use the charging cord provided.

Avoid storing and using the Vigo below -10 and above 50 degrees Celsius. Do not place the Vigo in direct sunlight or keep it in hot vehicles.

Stop using the Vigo if you notice these problems: odor, change in color, too much heat, change in shape, leaking, odd noises. If it is safe to do so, move the device away from anything that can catch fire.

## MEDICAL DEVICE INTERFERENCE

The Vigo and the Cubo contain components and radios that emit electromagnetic radiation. This electromagnetic radiation – although unlikely - may interfere with pacemakers, defibrillators, or other medical devices. Maintain a safe distance of separation between your medical device and the above mentioned Switch-It® devices. Consult your physician and medical device manufacturer for information specific to your medical device. If you suspect any of your Switch-It® devices are interfering with your pacemaker, defibrillator, or any other medical device, stop using the Switch-It® Vigo system.

## SPECIAL SAFETY WARNING

When driving with the Switch-It® Vigo system, do not forget to switch modes in order to be able to safely look around or control the actuator(s).

When driving with the Switch-It® Vigo system, make sure that the user is properly trained by a trained professional and have enough (a couple of weeks minimum) indoor experience driving the wheelchair before starting to drive outdoors in traffic.

Always make sure that the blink detection sensor is at a safe distance from your eye, cheek, or the corner of your mouth -1-3 cm - and in a position that a sudden change in the position of the Vigo won't hurt your eye.

Circumstances that can affect the operation of the Vigo:

The Switch-It® Vigo Head Drive Kit offers unprecedented freedom of movement by using wireless radio communication. The operation can be disturbed in environments with above-average Bluetooth or Wifi device usage, this may result in a safety stop.

# TRANSPORTATION AND STORAGE

The transportation and storage of the Vigo should be handled with care to maintain its functionality and longevity. The device's packaging, usually provided with foam inserts, serves as an ideal option for safe transportation, offering protection against physical shocks or impacts. When not in use, it is advisable to store the headset in a secure, protected space to safeguard its delicate components.

Temperature considerations play a role in storage, as the Link can withstand a wide temperature range from -20 to 50 degrees Celsius. However, this might not apply to the Vigo headset due to it being powered by a battery.

Please be aware that the battery may behave differently in colder conditions, battery life may be shorter!

For optimal performance and longevity, the recommended working conditions, including humidity, are between 40% to 60%.

When travelling or transporting the Switch-It® Vigo Head Drive Kit, it is recommended to ensure that all connections and cables are secure and well-organised to prevent any potential damage or disconnection. Overall, proper handling, adherence to storage guidelines, and protection from physical impacts are essential to guarantee the continued functionality and durability of the Vigo Bluetooth headset device and its associated components, contributing to a seamless and

reliable experience for wheelchair users seeking enhanced mobility control.

# **Getting Started**

### What's in the box

- Link (formerly known as GyroSet<sup>™</sup> Link)
- USB to micro-USB cable with magnetic extension to charge the Vigo
  *Warning!* Please do not use the magnetic extension for anything other than charging the Vigo!
- **Dongle** (formerly known as GyroSet<sup>™</sup> Dongle)
- Vigo with plastic "C" mounting ring
- Ear cushion cover
- Special USB C-type cable to connect the Link and the Cubo

#### A Please handle this cable with care!

Due to the nature of its placement, it can be damaged easily. If that happens, please <u>contact support</u> and ask for a replacement.

Do not attempt to replace the cable with other USB C cables! It is a crosslink cable specially made for these devices.

**WARNING** Magnetic components, such as those found in magnetic charging cables, may interfere with the proper operation of medical devices, including but not limited to pacemakers, defibrillators, and insulin pumps.







### Vigo

What does the Vigo do?

The Vigo is a headset that measures the head movements of the user in three dimensions and transfers signals to the Cubo via Bluetooth to enable driving.

It also supports other functions such as receiving phone calls and listening to music (not recommended while driving).

**Important:** Please make sure to pay attention to the "Battery Low" warning signals from the Vigo. Depending on usage the Vigo will shut down after approx. 10 minutes from the first warning. Please make sure to put the Vigo on a USB charger as soon as the "Battery Low" warning has been announced. It is advised that users take a USB power bank with them when going outdoors.





# **WARNING** Do not bend the neck of the Vigo! Bending may damage it.

You can easily adjust its position by rotating it within the headband or repositioning the headband itself on the user's head. As a lightweight, wearable tech it is a delicate instrument, which must be handled with care!

### Cubo

What does the Cubo do?

The Cubo provides visual feedback to the end-user via its display. It also receives the signals from the Vigo, calculates the orientation of the user's head and transfers commands to the Link.



### LINK

What does the LINK do?

The Link translates the user's head movements into analog joystick signals that are interpreted by the wheelchair's controller system.



### Switch-It® Vigo Mouse Desktop Application

Switch-It® Vigo Mouse (formerly known as GyroSet<sup>™</sup> Mouse) is the desktop application that unlocks several extra features (like a virtual keyboard) for the Vigo as a computer mouse. It also allows users to customise settings for the mouse mode, for the best user experience.

Switch-It® Vigo Drive (formerly known as GyroSet<sup>™</sup> Drive) is a desktop application that allows specialists to customise the Vigo's sensitivity settings for the best driving experience.

If you find your headset difficult to use, please make sure to contact your local distributor to have them adjust settings!

When using a MAC computer, please make sure to follow these steps:

- 2. Locate the install file(.pkg) on your computer
- 3. Right click on the file name
- 4. Choose 'Open'
- 5. And click 'Open' again in the pop-up window. This will enable the installation of the application.

# Switch-It® Vigo Toolbox Mobile Application

Switch-It® Vigo Toolbox is a mobile application that helps users to manage their Head Drive & Mouse Networks, to add and/or remove new Switch-It® devices, and to keep their devices up to date with the latest firmware.

Switch-It® Vigo Toolbox is available on the App Store or Google Play



#### Important:

- We advise you to use Switch-It® Vigo Toolbox with only one phone at a time. Its safe usage on multiple phones is not yet fully supported.
- If at any time during the Network setup process your phone requests pairing with the Dongle, make sure Switch-It® Vigo Mouse (or Switch-It® Vigo Drive) is running on the computer the Dongle is plugged into. This is to provide the Dongle with a platform through which it can communicate with your phone.
- If Switch-It® Vigo Mouse (or Switch-It® Vigo Drive) is not running on your computer, no Pairing pop-up window will appear in which you can input the pairing code provided by your phone and the Network cannot be set up. Moreover, Cubo may get stuck in this state of offering to pair with the Dongle and no other device can connect to it, until this is resolved.
- The same applies to pairing your Dongle and Cubo. If Switch-It® Vigo Mouse (or Switch-It® Vigo Drive) is not running on your computer, no Pairing pop-up window will appear in which you can input the 6 digit pairing code/passkey provided by Cubo and the Network cannot be set up.

# Assembly instructions

## System connection diagram



To ensure the Vigo is securely attached into the headband, the open end of the C-ring should always point towards the end or the back of the Vigo (i.e. the "mouth" of the C should be perpendicular to the headband), otherwise, it can fall out of the headband.

*Important:* For safety reasons, make sure to charge the Vigo with the provided USB charging cable before the first use.



**WARNING** If you have a history of allergies to plastics, you should exercise care when using the headband.



Make sure to check the C-ring's position every time you put the headset on the user, or adjust the Vigo's position in the headband!



**WARNING** Please do not remove the C-ring from the Vigo! Removing the C-ring may damage the device.

### Link installation

The Link enables Switch-It® Vigo users to use their Vigo on a PGDT Omni or IOM or Quantum Q-Logic 3 EX Enhanced Display or SCIM Module or Dynamic Linx DLX-IN500 equipped wheelchair as a specialty input device (SID). The Omni is a universal specialty control interface that accepts signals from many different types of SIDs and translates them into commands compatible with the PG Drives Technology R-Net control system.

Before proceeding please make sure that one of the compatible devices is already installed on the chair and working properly. For more information on how to set up the Omni please follow the instructions of R-Net OMNI TECHNICAL MANUAL SK78813/7. It is possible to set up a control system so that it is unsuitable for some users or even some vehicles. Although this guide contains recommended settings for Omni for all of the above reasons it is important that you contact PG Drives Technology if you have the slightest doubt or if you need any advice on programming the product.

# Link Mounting

The Link enclosure has two M4 nuts at the back of the device that is designed specifically for mounting. As every vehicle and user is unique there is no general mounting bracket available.



Please make sure that the physical mounting meets the following criteria:

- □ To take advantage of the IP54 protection of the casing, cables must face the ground to prevent rain getting into the connector.
- □ The Link's mode selection touch interface (touch button with the logo) must be accessible for the caretaker.
- Devices that may produce high capacity charges, such as ionisators must be at a safe distance from the touch interface to avoid accidental activation.
- □ The audible feedback of the Link is of high importance for the user, placement should avoid blocking of the speaker.
- Please don't exceed the minimum working temperature of -20°C and the maximum of 50°C of the Link



**WARNING** Protection against water according to IP54 is guaranteed only in case the Link has been installed in a vertical position.

# Link Wiring to PGDT

The **Link** provides a proportional analog signal compatible with the PGDT Omni (and some other controller systems – see in System Requirements). The interface is a standard D-type connector, fitted with "detect link" and "fifth switch" functions. As there is no internal power source or auxiliary power input connector on the Link the power for operation is provided by the Omni.

If the Omni is configured with the programmable parameter "Sleep 12V" to cut the power on SID connectors when turned off, Link is going to be turned off as well. The Link doesn't require a permanent power supply. For power saving reasons "Sleep 12V" parameter is advised to be set in the R-Net system.

On the Link there are two connector interfaces. One of which is an integrated cable with a D-type connector on it to control the Omni (referred to as Omni cable) and another square shaped interface to connect the Cubo cable (referred to as Data cable).

The two interfaces of the Link (on the left, the square-shaped data connector)

The preferred SID port, if there is only one input device connected to the Omni is Port 1, as shown in the picture below. In case of using a PGDT IOM there is only one INPUT port where the D-type connector can be connected:

Please make sure that the wiring meets the following criteria:

- The Link must be properly connected to PGDT Omni or IOM or Quantum Q-Logic 3 via an Enhanced Display or a SCIM Module.
  - The Link D-type connector connecting to the wheelchair controller must be secured with screws.
  - Cable to the wheelchair must be tied to the frame to avoid accidental tearing or crushing by the movement of actuators.
  - Cable placement has to be designed so that cables are protected during accidental crashes if the wheelchair hits an obstacle.
  - The analog connector should be connected to Omni Port-1 or IOM INPUT only.

In case the Omni's SID detect function is turned on and the D-type connector has become disconnected, a screen will appear on the Omni with error code 0905:





**WARNING** Always make sure that the chair is configured in a way that the chair's on/off switch is available to the user, according to the manufacturer's guidance.

# **Cubo Mounting**

The Cubo enclosure has two M4 nuts at the back of the device that is designed specifically for mounting. As every vehicle and user is unique there is no general mounting bracket available.



- Devices that may produce radio interference, such as Smartphones, Pagers, Bluetooth devices must be kept out of the way and placed at a distance from the Cubo.
- □ The Cubo should be placed so that the display is visible for the user and the assistant/carer as well.
- □ To take advantage of the IP54 protection of the casing, cables must face the ground to prevent rain getting into the connector.
- □ We recommend placing the Cubo on the same side on which the user wears the Vigo.
- Please make sure that the placement of the Cubo allows for protection against mechanical damages (e.g. falling objects) for the display.

Please make sure that the wiring meets the following criteria:

- The Cubo must be properly connected to the Link and the Headrest Sensor.
  - The Cubo Micro-USB and the headrest's cable must be tied to the frame of the wheelchair to avoid accidental tearing or crushing by the movement of actuators.
  - The Cubo Micro-USB and the headrest's cable placement has to be designed so that cables are protected during accidental crashes if the wheelchair hits an obstacle.

Headrest and Headrest Sensor

For safety reasons we strongly recommend using the Headrest Sensor as it has been designed to fulfil both emergency stop and drive start functions while enabling the users to rest their head while not driving.

#### Headrest Requirements

Suitable headrests must have a fairly hard foam density and a large enough flat or almost flat surface space to accommodate the full size of the Headrest Sensor in its pouch. It can be mounted on the outside of the headrest or placed under the removable cover of the wheelchair's headrest. The removable cover must be a tight fit around the headrest foam to ensure the sensor is snug and tight between the surfaces to stop it from moving and keep it secure.

An example of the ideal shape of the headrest:



Unsuitable headrest examples:

Very puffy and soft, low density foams that do not allow the sensor to operate at optimum performance.



Headrests that are too curved or with too small a surface to accommodate the size of the pouch or sensor alone.



Hard rubberized with deep curves and dips not allowing a flat enough surface for the sensor.



Jack connector on Cubo

Jack connector is the interface for connecting auxiliary buttons and sensors to the system. The route of the signal coming from the button can be redirected to be processed by either the Cubo itself or by the Link. By default, the signal is processed by Cubo.

- The Link as the receiver is compatible strictly with sensors and buddy buttons manufactured by NowTechnologies Ltd. such as the Headrest Sensor.
- In case the Cubo is set to receive Jack signals any kind of NowTechnologies or third party buddy button can be used.

How to place the Headrest Sensor on the wheelchair



Please make sure that the wiring meets the following criteria:

- The Headrest Sensor must be properly connected to Cubo.
  - The Headrest Sensor's cable must be tied to the frame of the wheelchair to avoid accidental tearing or crushing by the movement of actuators.
  - The Headrest Sensor's cable placement has to be designed so that cables are protected during accidental crashes if the wheelchair hits an obstacle.
- The Headrest Sensor must be tied to the headrest by the reusable tie and strap in a way that it won't move during extended periods of usage.
- Please make sure that the position of the Headrest Sensor is easily reachable for the specific user during driving.

# Setting up the System

# Setting up the Omni and the Link

The Link and the Cubo enables Switch-It® Vigo users to use their Vigo on a PGDT Omni or IOM equipped wheelchair as a specialty input device (SID). The Omni is a universal specialty control interface that accepts signals from many different types of SIDs and translates them into commands compatible with the PG Drives Technology R-Net control system.

*Important:* Please be aware, whilst controlling your chair via the Omni (and the Switch-It® Vigo Head Drive system), you won't be able to use your regular Joystick!

If you would like to use the Joystick instead, turn off the Omni and turn the system back on with the power button on the Joystick.

#### Programming the Omni

For programming the Omni please follow the instructions provided by Penny and Giles Drive Technologies. There are three methods of programming the Omni. Details of the actual programmable parameters are given in the SK78813 Programming chapter. Ensure the R-Net Control System's Drive, Acceleration and Deceleration settings are at a comfortable and safe level prior to attempting to program the Omni to suit the user.

Refer to the R-Net Technical Manual SK77981 or the On-Board Programming Manual SK78571 for details of how to program the R-Net Control System. Programming should only be conducted by professionals with in-depth knowledge of PG Drives Technology electronic control systems. Incorrect programming could result in an unsafe set-up. NowTechnologies Ltd. accepts no liability for losses of any kind if these conditions are not met.

**WARNING** The Omni can be put to sleep by selecting that option in the User Menu. To wake the Omni, the following SID sequence is required: Left, Right, Left, Right. Note, this waking method only works if the Omni has been put to sleep via the User Menu. For that to work, the "Sleep 12V" parameter has to be turned off to allow the Link to operate constantly. For safe operation of the chair NowTechnologies does not recommend the above-described scenario, instead please **install the Headrest Sensor** within the reach of the User that can act as an emergency stop as well. For more instructions, see the "Headrest and Headrest Sensor" section.

Please make sure that your R-Net configuration meets the following criteria:

- The correct SID port is configured as proportional.
- Sleep 12V parameter is set.
- User control is set.

• Drive, Acceleration and Deceleration settings are at a comfortable and safe level.

#### To avoid control problems when changing your seating position, we recommend modifying your setting in the Omni to allow control of the actuators only when the head is tilted either to the left or right side.

### Setting up the IOM and the Link

Setting up the IOM with the Link should only be conducted by the distributor or a PGDT trained person.

# Setting up the Dynamic Controls Linx DLX-IN500 and the Link

Setting up the Dynamic Controls Linx DLX-IN500 with the Link should only be conducted by the distributor or a Dynamic Controls trained person. Setting up the Quantum Rehab Q-Logic 3 EX Enhanced Display or SCIM Module and the Link

Setting up the Quantum Q-Logic 3 EX Enhanced Display or SCIM Module with the Link should only be conducted by the distributor or a Q-Logic trained person.

# Pairing instructions

In order to communicate securely, Bluetooth devices need to be paired. This process might be familiar from using other Bluetooth devices. Scenarios where pairing might be needed:

- *Phone Dongle:* Make sure the Switch-It® Vigo Mouse application is running on your computer. When the phone offers the pairing code, type it in the pairing window that appeared on the screen of your computer.
- *Phone Cubo:* A 6 digit passkey will appear on the screen of the Cubo, enter it into the input field that has just appeared on your phone.
- Cubo Dongle: Make sure the Switch-It® Vigo Mouse application is running on your computer. A 6 digit passkey will appear on the screen of Cubo, enter the code in the input field that has just appeared on the screen of your computer.

#### Important:

- Pairing Dongle with your phone or Cubo will require Switch-It® Vigo Mouse (or Switch-It® Vigo Drive) to run on the computer the Dongle is plugged into. This is to provide the Dongle with a platform through which it can communicate with your phone or the Cubo.
- If Switch-It® Vigo Mouse (or Switch-It® Vigo Drive) is not running on your computer, no Pairing pop-up window will appear in which you can input the pairing code provided by your phone or the Cubo and the Network cannot be set up. Moreover, Cubo may get stuck in this state of offering to pair with the Dongle and no other device can connect to it, until this is resolved.
- If you're adding a second Dongle to your network, it too will need to be paired with your Cubo through the same process described above.

# Setting up the Vigo

The Vigo was paired to your system at the factory.

*Important:* For safety reasons, make sure to charge the Vigo with the provided USB charging cable before the first use.

Pairing with your phone (optional: to receive calls and listen to auditory type entertainment)



**WARNING** Using this function will drastically decrease the battery life of your Vigo from an average of 14 hours of runtime to 4-5 hours.

- 1. In the mobile phone Settings, turn on Bluetooth. (iOS and Android: Settings > Bluetooth > On)
- To pair Vigo with your mobile phone, press and hold the Vigo Multi-Function Button for 7 seconds, until you hear the word "Pairing" in the speaker. The Alert LED will flash alternating red and blue.
- 3. In your mobile phone Settings, search for new Bluetooth devices.
- 4. Select "Vigo".
- 5. Once successfully paired, the Alert LED will stop flashing, and you will hear "Connected" spoken from the Vigo earpiece.

start running automatically (depending on the operating system version and the setup of your computer).

- 2. Insert the Dongle into the computer's USB port.
- 3. Turn on the Omni. This will turn on your Link and your Cubo.
- 4. In Switch-It® Vigo Drive, go to Drive Profile. For further information, click the Help (?) icon in the top right corner or download the Switch-It® Vigo Drive Help document.

The Link translates the user's head movements into analog joystick sweeps. For that to function correctly all Link parameters must be set according to the individual user's needs. The configuration of the Link can be achieved through the Switch-It® Vigo Drive application - available only for distributors - that provides an interactive Help and settings Wizard, which you can find by clicking on the question mark icon in the top right corner of the application on any page. The Vigo can measure the tilting of the head in the four main directions, forward, backward, left and right.

1. Based on the factory default parameters, and according to the results of the test drive with a joystick, the assistant shall identify the highest speed values of the chair that enables the user to drive the chair safely:

- 1. Maximum Forward Speed
- 2. Maximum Reverse Speed
- 3. Maximum Turning Speed

2. It is recommended to set both acceleration and deceleration speeds to a relatively low value in order to avoid the swinging of the head. This could disturb the operation of the sensors.

- Maximum Forward Acceleration: 15-35
- Maximum Forward Deceleration: 20-40
- Maximum Reverse Acceleration: 15-35
- Maximum Reverse Deceleration: 20-40
- Maximum Turn Acceleration: 25-45
- Maximum Turn Deceleration: 30-40

3. The assistant shall validate the drivability of the chair by using the chair themselves.

Twitch of the chair during acceleration, deceleration or especially driving forward can be caused by the swinging of the head. In this case, we recommend increasing the value of the Tremor Damping from zero step by step, until the chair is able to accelerate without twitches.

4. The end-user should validate the driving parameters by driving the chair with the Switch-It® Vigo Head Drive Kit. The assistant shall modify the maximum speed values and the value of the Tremor Damping according to the user's needs.

5. It is recommended to create a copy of the final profile as a basis for other profiles. When for example the user needs a second profile for indoor driving, it is enough to use the copy of the outdoors profile and change only the maximum forward speed value and leave the rest untouched.

The above-mentioned example values and ranges can greatly differ from user to user. It is recommended to always follow the above process when setting values to gain safe driving and smooth acceleration.

# How to wear and drive with the Vigo

# How to wear the Vigo



 Find a comfortable seating position for the user and adjust the headrest so that the Headrest Sensor is always in reach for the user (3-5 cm). Pushing the Headrest Sensor with the back of the head should always be an easy operation. Try to do that several times and adjust your chair/wheelchair's seating or headrest position if required.
2. Try the Vigo on the user's head. Adjust the headband in a way that it sits firmly on the top of the user's head, and they can wear it comfortably for hours. To ensure operational efficiency, adjust the Vigo on the head. The sensor should be placed approximately 1-3 cm from the movable parts of the user's face (corner of the eye, cheek, corner of the mouth, etc.)

Turn on the System (for assistants/carers)

- To turn on the Vigo, press and hold the Multi-Function Button on the Vigo for about 5 seconds. The Alert LED will flash 3 times, Vigo will vibrate once, and you will hear "Power on" spoken from the Vigo earpiece if it's close enough to your ears.
- 2. Put the Vigo safely on the head of the user: place it on the user's head, adjust the click sensor's flexible tube as described in this Manual. The sensor should be placed approximately 3 cm from the movable part of the user's face (corner of the eye, cheek, corner of the mouth, etc.)
- 3. Turn on the Omni. This will turn on the Link and the Cubo
- 4. You will see the Bluetooth icon of the Cubo flashing and a No device text.



5. The Cubo will recognize the Vigo and the text "Link Drive" will appear.



6. Ask the user to push the Headrest Sensor, and when he/she starts hearing the sounds, push it again before the sounds are over. This will activate the Drive mode and Deactivate again to finish the calibration process. At the end of the process, the Link will be in an inactive state.

For other status displays, please see the Cubo System Status Feedback section in the Appendix.



**WARNING** If you ever experience that the chair is not following your directions accurately, stop driving and recalibrate the system. Follow the directions above and put the Vigo on a stable and flat surface after step 5 until the calibration icon changes to a checkmark (usually 5-10 seconds).

### Driving and mousing with the Vigo

### Switch modes with the Vigo

The default mode after the turn-on process is inactive drive mode.

#### Drive mode

To start driving, give the Headrest Sensor a short-press with the back of the head (0-1 seconds) and assume a comfortable, neutral head position. The (adjustable) countdown should allow enough time to do that. It's best to take up this neutral position with the chin held up slightly to make moving forward with the chair an unobstructed, comfortable experience.

#### Emergency stop/Leave driving mode:

Push the Headrest Sensor with the back of the head with a fast (faster than reversing) movement. The chair will react immediately to the push of the sensor.

The chair stops when the head leaves the range set in the Switch-It® Vigo Drive application or when the user is making fast, seizure-like movements.

### Enter the Omni menu:

When the driving mode is inactive, use a face-wink gesture to enter the menu of the Omni.

To be able to navigate in the menu, the head drive needs to be in active mode, please use the Headrest Sensor to activate navigation in the menu.



**WARNING** Please do not leave the Omni menu by the Exit option in the menu as this will cause you to immediately drive the chair. Instead, deactivate the menu navigation first by using the Headrest Sensor and then switch to drive mode with a facewink to continue driving.

#### Mouse mode

To use this function, a connected set of Dongle and Vigo is sufficient.

If a Cubo is present in the network, the user can switch between 'drive mode' and 'mouse mode' by long-pressing the Headrest Sensor, as described below.

Plug the Dongle in the computer's USB port.

The colour of the LED will indicate whether the Dongle is communicating with the Cubo or Vigo.

In a network where a Cubo is present, mousing can be initiated by shortpressing the Headrest Sensor.

In case of a 'Dongle and Vigo only' connection, you can start mousing by pressing the Vigo's Multi-Function button.

In this setup we advise users to disable the headset button in their phone settings or disconnect their smartphone from the Vigo, otherwise the Multi Function button will start mousing on the computer and start playing music (or answer calls) on your phone at the same time.

The mousing experience can be greatly enhanced by using the **Switch-It® Vigo Mouse** application, which allows the user to adjust and finetune how the cursor reacts to head movements. Its toolbar unlocks other mouse functionalities, like the right-click and the middle-click, provides shortcuts for modifier keys (Ctrl/Cmd, Alt/Option, Shift) and the most used editing functionalities for easy access.

During mousing a face-wink is equivalent with the click of a mouse.

Details on how to use the software are included in its Help section (question mark in the top right corner).

For a detailed explanation of the Dongle's LED colors, please see the Dongle LED Status Feedback section in the Appendix.

### Standby mode

This mode is only available in case of using a full network (Link, Cubo, Vigo and Dongle). The Standby mode has to be enabled in Switch-It® Vigo Toolbox, under the Device Order menu.

The mode itself is only accessible if the Dongle has been removed or it's out of range. Long-pressing the Headrest Sensor will switch from Drive mode to Standby mode in this case. This mode has no active state.

The purpose of this mode is to act as filler, in case the user doesn't need the Drive mode (not even in its passive state), but doesn't have a Dongle nearby to switch to Mouse mode as a stand in.

#### Switching between available functions

If the user has a system of at least the following connected devices: Link, Cubo, Vigo and Dongle (i.e. the potential to use 'drive mode' or 'mouse mode'), then they can switch between the modes these devices provide (in this case driving and mousing) by long-pressing (1-5 seconds) the Headrest Sensor.

The Cubo's screen will show the current mode (e.g.: LINK drive, MOUSE).

### Resting

Tap the Headrest Sensor with the back of the head and hold it there for over 5 seconds. The Vigo Headset will give out a short vibration, signalling that the system entered rest mode, and the Cubo's screen will light up and stay that way for the duration of the rest. This function enables you to rest your head without the risk of accidentally initiating driving or mousing.

### Two Dongle Support

In the current release we support the use of 2 Dongles in one network. This option may be beneficial for users with two computers (e.g.: laptop and desktop computer, home computer and work computer). This way they don't have to carry their one dongle wherever they want to use the mouse function.

An extra Dongle can be added to the network in Switch-It® Vigo Toolbox under Network Management.

Switching between two active Dongles (if they are both in range) is as easy as switching between 'drive mode' and 'mouse mode' except in this case there are 2 'mouse modes' from which the user can choose, by long-pressing the Headerst Sensor.

*Important:* Please do not try to add more than 2 Dongles to one network. Our system can only manage a maximum of 2 Dongles safely in one network.

### Drive with your Vigo

- 1. Imagine that your head is like a regular joystick.
- 2. Tilt your head (make sure not to turn as it has no effect) to the direction you wish to go. The tilt amount is proportional to the speed of the wheelchair's movement. Make slow, fluid and small movements with your head to avoid activating the emergency stop.
- 3. To come to a halt, move your head into the neutral position (into the dead-zone)
- 4. To stop driving press the Headrest Sensor.

For each drive session, a new neutral position can be selected, this helps in case the users change their posture.

#### Using the OMNI Menu

- 1. To avoid control problems when changing your seating position, we recommend modifying your setting in the OMNI to control the actuators only with head side tilts.
- 2. When the chair is not moving the Vigo's click sensor (face wink) can be used to enter into the Omni Menu.
- 3. Activate the head drive by tapping firmly the Headrest Sensor to navigate the menu.
- 4. Your head will act as a joystick to help you go through all the available preferences.
- 5. Select menu items with tilting your head right as with a joystick, but make sure to return to the neutral position.
- 6. Use the face wink gesture again to deactivate the Omni menu navigation.

Other Vigo Functions:

Answer an incoming call

Short-press the Multi-Function Button to answer the incoming call.

End a call

Short-press the Multi-Function Button to end the current call.

Reject a call

Long-press the Multi-Function Button for 2 seconds to reject the incoming call.

Adjust the volume

Press "VOL+" to increase volume. You will hear "beep" from the Vigo earpiece.

Press "VOL-" to decrease volume. You will hear "beep" from the Vigo earpiece.

### Play/Pause

Short-press the Multi-Function Button to play/pause the music.

### Power off

To power off the Vigo, press and hold the Multi-Function Button for 5 seconds. The Alert LED will flash blue 3 times, and you will hear "Power off" spoken from the Vigo earpiece.

### Battery charging & battery level

Charging: Use the included USB cable for charging. Simply attach the magnetic end of the charging cable to its counterpart that comes already inserted in the Vigo.



The Alert LED will turn red while charging.

Charging time: 2 hours. When fully charged, the Alert LED will turn off. Low battery: You will hear "Battery Low" spoken from the Vigo earpiece. **Important:** Please make sure to pay attention to the "Battery Low" warning signals from the Vigo. Depending on usage the Vigo will shut down after approx. 10 minutes from the first warning. Please make sure to put the Vigo on a USB charger as soon as the "Battery Low" warning has been announced. It is advised that users take a USB power bank with them when going outdoors.

### Music streaming

Streaming audio is initiated and controlled by your mobile phone. When a call rings, any streaming audio will automatically pause, to enable you to answer the call. When the call has ended, the streaming audio will resume.

Play/Pause: Click the Multi-Function Button once. Previous song: Long-press "Vol+" for 2 seconds. Next song: Long-press "VOL-" for 2 seconds. Vigo Product Specifications

**WARNING** Do not press and hold the combination of the Power button and the Volume down (-) buttons. This will put the Vigo into DUT (service mode) which will render the Vigo unusable. In this state the Vigo cannot be turned off, you have to wait for the battery to deplete completely.

# Please make sure that the following criteria are met before trying to drive the wheelchair with the Switch-It® Vigo Drive System:

- □ Understanding of the intended use of the Cubo and the Vigo by getting familiar with this User Manual.
- □ The adjustment of the headrest: The user must be able to reach the Headrest Sensor at any time to be able to activate it.
- □ The intended direction of movement must be set by using Switch-It® Vigo Drive.
- □ The user's head movement range must be set by using Switch-It® Vigo Drive.
- Out of operation range for the faint detection threshold must be set using Switch-It® Vigo Drive.
- Tremor filter must be set using Switch-It® Vigo Drive.
- □ Click sensor functions and parameters must be set using Switch-It® Vigo Drive.
- □ Click sensor long-press maximal timeout must be set using Switch-It® Vigo Drive.

- □ Centre mode and parameters must be set using Switch-It® Vigo Drive:
  - Please make sure to check if the center mode is set to "Countdown" in Switch-It® Vigo Drive. If yes, the "Timeout" has to be set.
- □ The maximum speed, acceleration, deceleration of the head drive profile of the wheelchair controller must be adjusted:
  - □ Settings of the controller must be administered by specifically trained and authorized personnel.
  - Acceleration and deceleration settings of the wheelchair shall not cause inertia on the user's head that the user cannot compensate for.
  - Maximum speed must always be in accordance with the local regulations.
- □ The service network must be used only for the time when changes are made to the personal drive profile.

- □ The user should avoid:
  - Environments with extreme radio interference when driving wirelessly as it may cause the wheelchair to stop if it receives no signals.
  - □ Environments with extreme temperatures. The working temperature of Link is between -20°C and 50°C.
  - The user shall be aware of the fact that the Link must be selected by using the Headrest Sensor for control with the Vigo.
- □ The user must be trained and know how to handle the center detection (jump to center).
  - In case the mode is set to countdown, the user's head shall be motionless in a neutral position after activating the drive function for a few seconds until the countdown stops.
  - In case the mode is set to automatic, the drive won't start until the head is put into a motionless state for less than a second.

Be aware that the Vigo acts as a joystick within the R-Net control system:

- By programming the wheelchair controller, various functions can be tied to "fifth button" presses, in this case, the click sensor of the Vigo.
- □ When the fifth button's long-press timeout is set to a smaller value on the R-Net than on the Link the click sensor can turn the chair into sleep mode.
- In case the fifth button function is programmed so that the User can access the Omni menu, the Vigo can be used to navigate within the menu using head gestures similar to the controller's joystick.
- In case the fifth button function is programmed so that the User can control actuators, the Vigo can be used to move the actuators using head gestures similar to the controller's joystick.
- □ After the drive mode is initiated, a distinguishable audio feedback can be heard.
  - □ The chair will move according to the head movements and the profile settings of the Link and the controller.
  - □ The chair will move until the function is deactivated or failure is detected. The chair stops immediately if a failure is detected, a cable is unplugged or wireless signal is lost.
  - □ The chair can be stopped while in drive mode by moving the user's head to the initial neutral position.

- □ In case the center of driving feels off compared to the initial center, the user shall stop and reinitiate drive, taking on a new center/neutral position.
- □ That depletion of the Vigo's battery will cause the chair to stop.
  - □ The Vigo's battery must be charged on a daily basis.
- □ If the Vigo falls off, the chair stops.
- ❑ A sudden backward movement of the head inside the turning dead zone will force the system to execute an emergency brake of the chair.
- □ If the user's head reaches the safety zone in any direction the chair will stop.
- □ If the user's head is in the range of the center dead zone the chair won't move or it will stop.
- If the cable connecting the Link and PGDT Omni or IOM equipped wheelchair gets damaged and/or short-circuited the chair will stop. Short circuits on analog lines are handled by Rnet's safety system, because neither GND nor VCC are accepted as analog control voltages.

- □ User or carer intervention may be required when experiencing unusual behaviour. The Safety switch button needs to be pressed or the Headset tilted to the safety limit to induce stopping. Tremor filter can be used to compensate for vibrations.
- If there is no BLE data stream available, the Cubo gives a stop command to Link which is passed on to the chair, and the chair stops immediately.
- When in doubt, just remember, the chair can be stopped immediately by tilting the Headset to the previously set safety limits!
